



# MEMBERSHIP EXPECTATIONS

***Rotarians consider their membership a privilege because the experience changes lives.***

Every privilege has a corresponding responsibility. Listed below are the things you will be asked to do as a Rotarian. Each can be viewed as an opportunity as well as an expectation.

1. Support of the Object of Rotary and the Rotary Four-Way Test.
2. Be familiar with Rotary programs and serve as an ambassador of Rotary.
3. Maintain 50% participation (attend 30 or more club meetings, service activities, committee meetings, social events or on-line make-ups per year). Weekly breakfasts are on Thursday at 7:30 am at the Bridgewater Banquet and Conference Center, 10561 Sawmill Parkway.
4. Serve on at least one committee and attend a majority of its meetings.
5. Make a personal contribution annually to both the Rotary International Foundation and the club's Olentangy Rotary Foundation, which funds all of our service projects.
6. Comply with the Club Bylaws.
7. Provide leadership.
8. Identify other community/business leaders who would enjoy the privileges of Rotary, and propose them as new members.

## **Financial Investment:**

Dues are \$200 annually, payable July 1<sup>st</sup> and January 1<sup>st</sup>. Active members must pre-pay their breakfast expense at \$12 per week which is billed quarterly. A one-time initiation fee of \$75 applies to individuals who are not already members of a Rotary Club.
